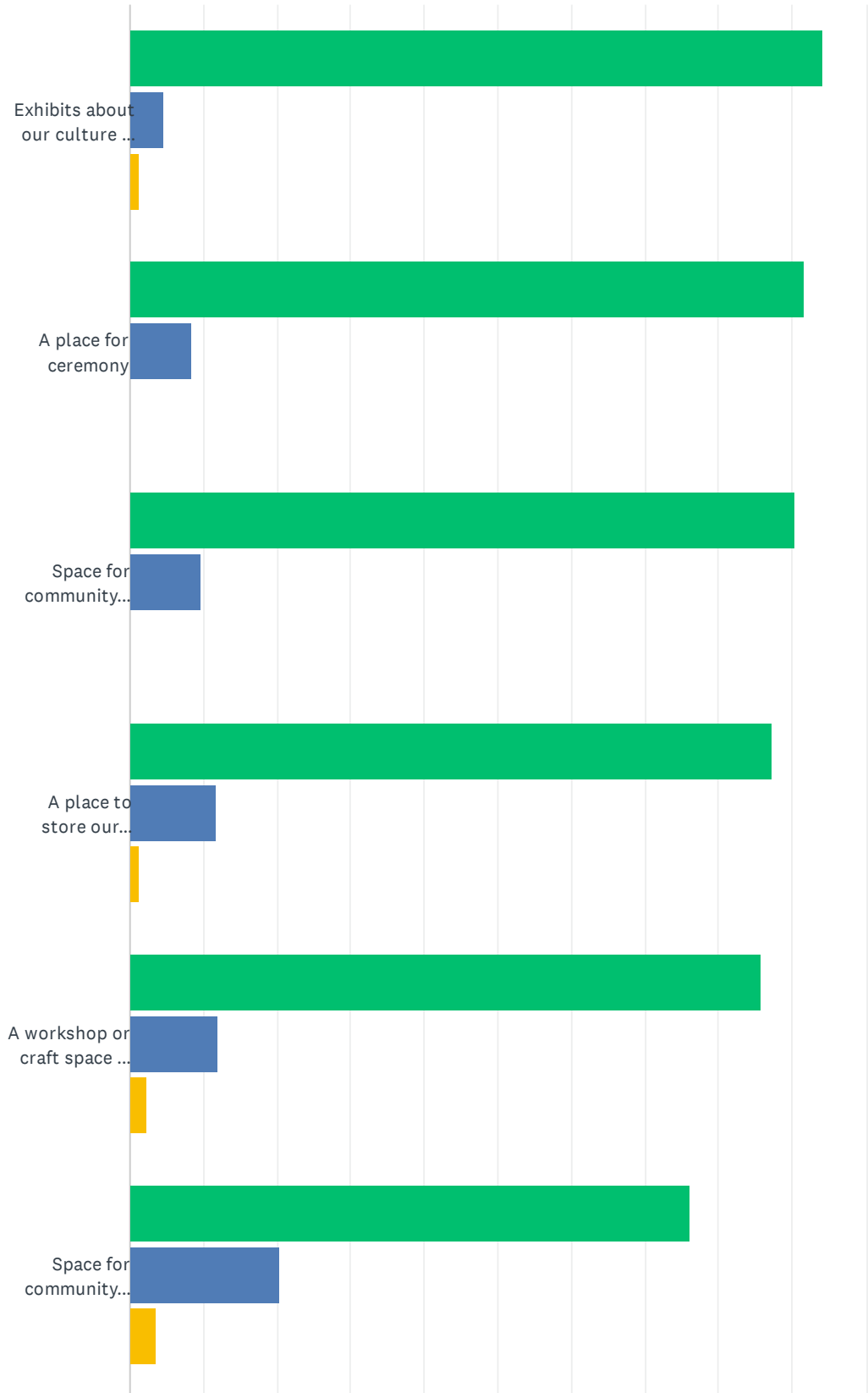

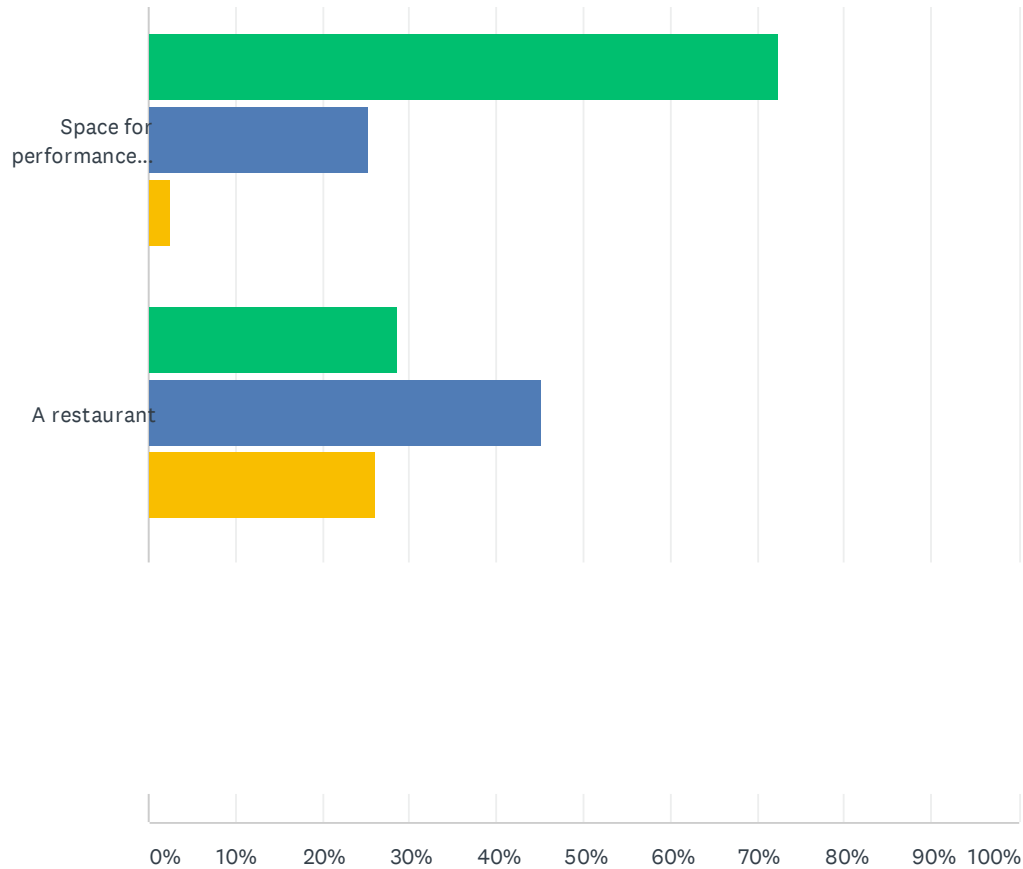


Q1 Which of the following would you like to see in the Kebaowek Cultural Centre?

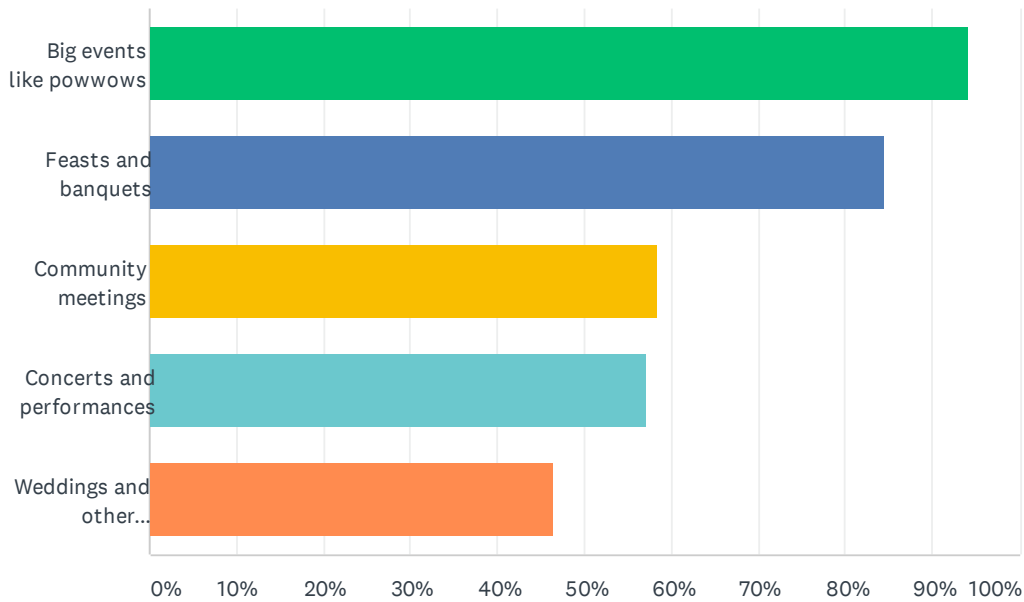

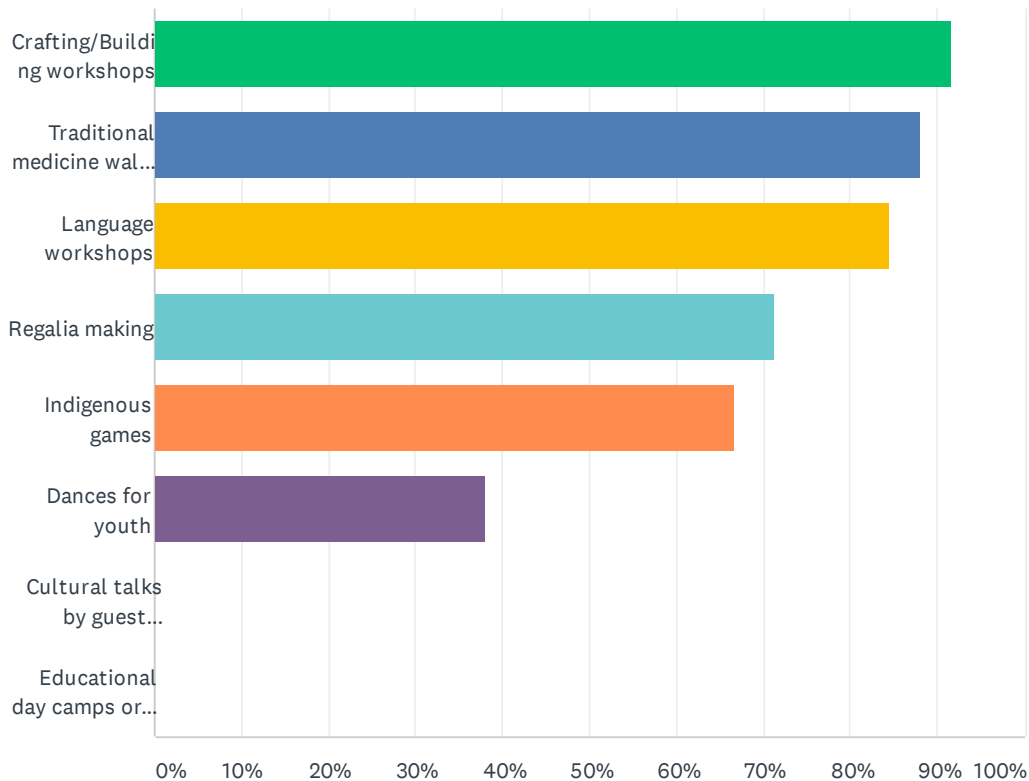

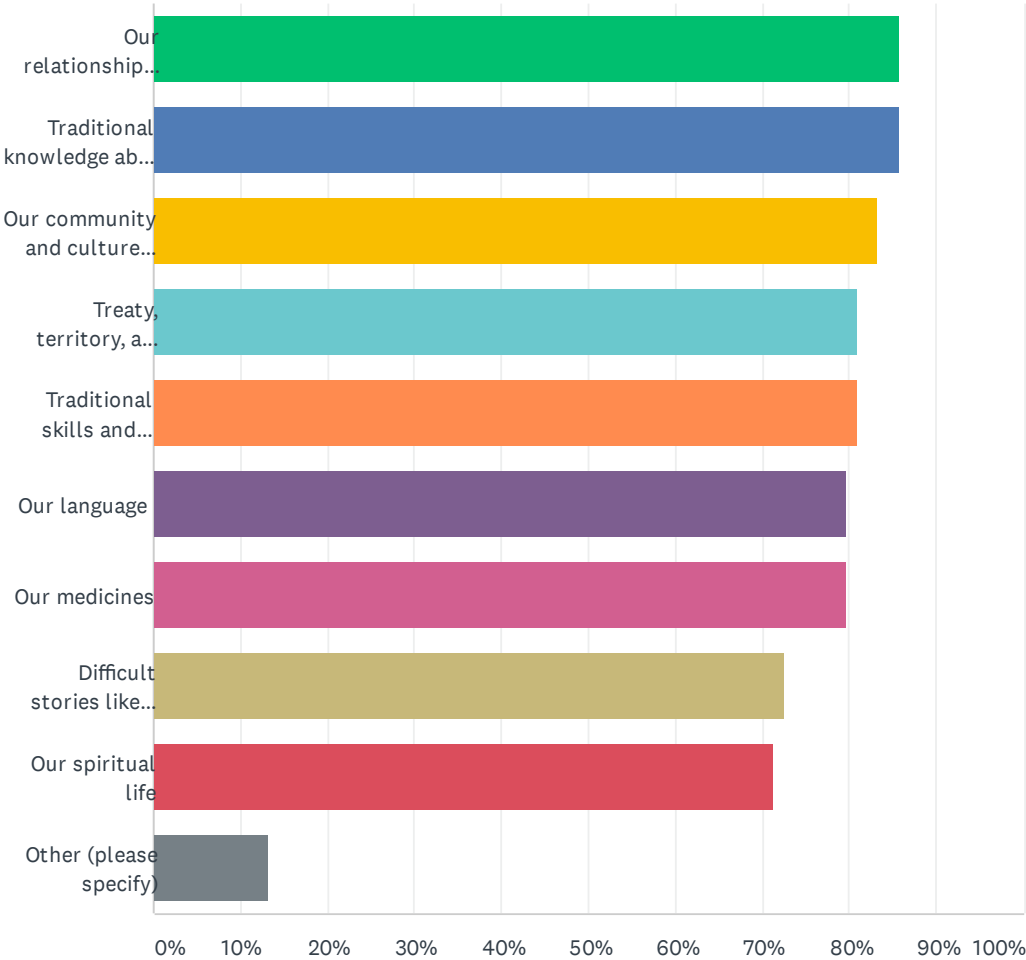

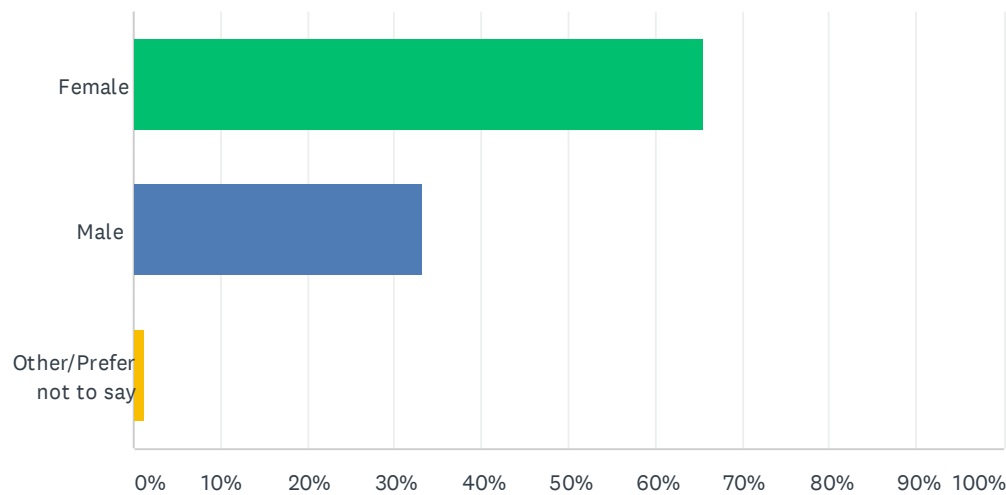

Q8 Please tell us your gender

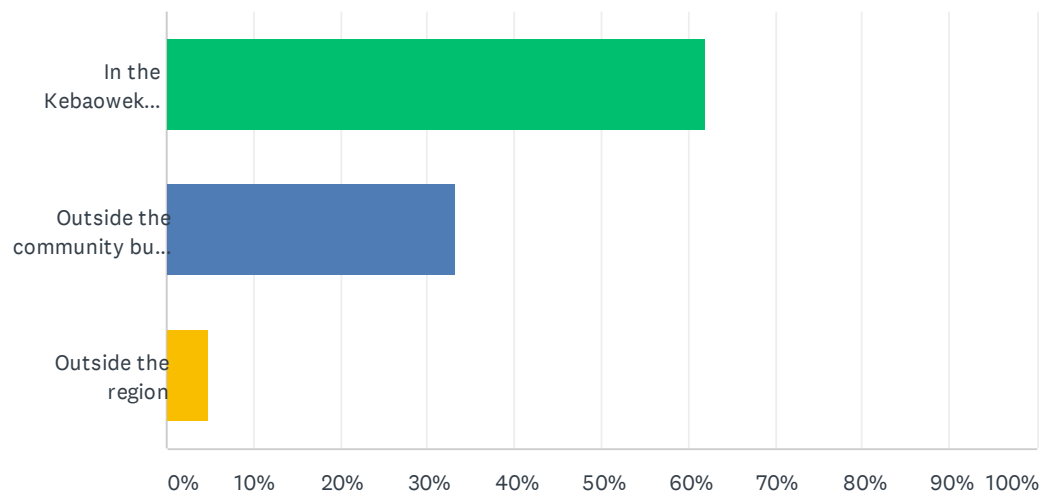
